## The Federalist Party

- Formed by Alexander Hamilton in about 1792. The
- Felt that the federal government should be stronger than the state government.
- Showed little interest in states' rights.
- Believed in rule by the educated (appealed to merchants, bankers, lawyers, editors, landowners, and industrialists.)
- Thought the best way for the country to grow strong was through industrialization (manufacturing and selling products), not farming.
- Wanted their government to be modeled after the British government, but without a king.
- Hamilton proposed the ambitious Hamiltonian economic program involved setting up a national bank.


## The Democratic-Republican Party

- Founded by Thomas Jefferson
- The dominant political party in the United States from 1800 until the 1820s.
- created the party in order to oppose the economic and foreign policies of the Federalists
- Foreign policy issues were central; the party supported good relations with France.
- The party promoted states' rights
- Supported the importance of farmers and an agrarian (farming) society over bankers, industrialists, and merchants.

Light
Electrical energy can be changed to light energy with light bulbs in lamps, televisions, and computer monitors.

## Heat

Electrical energy can be changed to heat energy in stoves, toasters, and ovens.

Sound
Electrical energy can be changed to sound energy with radios and televisions.
