2022 SC READY and SCPASS Test Results

Students in grades 3-8 participated in the SC READY state assessment. These tests are aligned to the South Carolina College-and Career-Ready Standards for English Language Arts (ELA) and math. Students in grades 4 and 6 participated in the SC Palmetto Assessment of State Standards (SCPASS) tests. These tests are aligned to the South Carolina Academic Standards in science. During the 2021-2022 school year, all students in grades 3-8 took state assessments online, unless paper-based administration was required based on academic plans.

2022 SAT Test Results (Grade 12)

The Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) is a standardized test often used in the college admissions process. SAT results are based on graduating seniors in 2022. Students are counted only once, no matter how often they test and only their latest score is used in these calculations.

Total scores are calculated using the actual (before rounding) score for each test. Twelfth graders actively enrolled in SC Public Schools as of the 135th day of school year 2022 are included in the calculations.

Noted below are the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) mean scores for seniors in Dillon School District Four compared to graduating seniors that took the test in the state and nation.

2022 EOCEP Test Results

The End-of-Course Examination Program (EOCEP) is a statewide assessment program that requires test administration to South Carolina students that are enrolled in identified courses. The Education Accountability Act of 1998 (EAA) requires the administration of end-of-course examinations in gateway courses awarded units of credit in English, math, science, and social studies. Students that are scheduled in gateway courses must be assessed with mandated EOCEP tests upon the completion of four (4) required courses prior to graduation: Algebra I, Biology I, English 2, and U.S. History and the Constitution.

The chart below denotes 2022 End-of-Course Examination Program percentage pass rates.

2022 ACT Test Results (Grade 12)

The American College Test (ACT) is a national college admissions examination that consists of subject area tests in English, mathematics, reading, and science. The test includes multiple-choice questions, with a 36 being the highest possible score. The test is offered six (6) times per year in the U.S. and is usually taken during a student's junior or senior year of high school.

2021-2022 Reasons to Celebrate!

- East Elementary School began the initiative to become a Leader in Me school. Staff members attended a two-part training on the Seven Habits of Highly Effective People.
- Save the Children After-School students organized a “Baby It’s Cold Outside!” service learning project. They collected items, such as, coats, blankets, socks, gloves, scarves, and toboggans to donate to the City of Dillon Police Department.
- East students enjoyed various field trips to broaden their background of experiences. The 4K students and 2nd grade students visited Ripley’s Aquarium in Myrtle Beach. The 3rd graders enjoyed going to a movie theatre in Florence to see a movie based on a book they had read.
- South Elementary School celebrated students’ academic success and growth by hosting a Wild Kitten Poster Parade for i-Ready math and reading and quarterly award programs.
- South Elementary faculty, staff, and students focused on restorative practices to build community, strengthen relationships, and to make wise choices when faced with a problem.
- Students at Stewart Heights were recognized for earning 200 points or more on their MAP tests. They were inducted into the MAP 200 Club Hall of Fame.
- Stewart Heights Elementary School hosted several parent involvement activities throughout the school year. Parents were invited to attend conferences, Open House, orientation, Title I Parent Meetings, Parent Learning Nights, and to come for the Letter Land Parade.
- Lake View Elementary School initiated a number of new clubs to offer students opportunities to participate in academic, artistic, and social activities: Crafty Kids Club, Junior Beta Club, STEM, Student Council, Tinkling Club, WWG Morning News, and WWG Yearbook.
- Lake View Elementary School continued their affiliation with Save the Children. Students were able to receive free tutoring in-school, after-school, and during the month of June.
- Faculty and staff members at Gordon Elementary worked hard to provide social, emotional, and academic supports to all students.
- Gordon Elementary initiated an afterschool Academic Enrichment Program. Students in the program showed growth on state assessments in the areas of reading and math.
- The Dillon Middle School chorus was awarded an Excellent rating at the Carowinds Festival of Music.
- The Dillon Middle School band received two prestigious awards: Superior rating at the Carowinds Festival of Music & Outstanding Performance Award given by the SC Band Director Association.
- The graduating class of 2022 at Dillon High School earned \$7.2 million dollars in scholarships.
- The Dillon High School JROTC and GT Honors Chorus hosted and outstanding Veteran’s Day Program to honor our Nation’s heroes.
- Dillon High School continued its Dual Enrollment partnership with Northeastern Technical College (NETC) for the 3rd consecutive year. Many students earned college credits while attending high school.
- Lake View High School students participated in the *Darius Leonard Maniac Challenge*. To be recognized, students had to meet academic and behavioral requirements. Academically, the students had to complete all school assignments and read a prescribed number of selections. Behaviorally, students could not have any discipline referrals. Over 120 students met the challenge!
- The seniors in the graduating class of 2022 at Lake View High School applied to over 30 colleges and received over 100 acceptances.
- During the 2021-2022 school year, the Adult and Continuing Education Center served as a Pearson-VUE Testing Center for GED applicants. Nine (9) graduates received secondary credentials.
- The Adult Education Consortium includes Dillon, Latta, and Lake View. The Adult Education office offers diploma, GED, and basic classes, as well as, workforce preparation.

2022 Career Readiness Assessment (Grade 11)

During the 2021-2022 school year, the S.C. Department of Education (SCDE) announced that the ACT Corporation had been awarded the contract to provide high school students with a career assessment test. All students in their third year of high school after their initial enrollment in the ninth grade were required to take three (3) WorkKeys tests (Applied Math, Graphic Literacy, and Workplace Documents). The assessment provided a credentialing approach to yield test-takers with certificates to take future employers. Students were exposed to employability skills and foundational academic knowledge that employers seek and jobs demand.

Students that completed all three (3) sections of the WorkKeys assessment earned a certificate in one (1) of four (4) skill levels: Bronze (Level 3), Silver (Level 4), Gold (Level 5), and Platinum (Level 6), with Platinum being the highest credential to be earned.

- Applied Math** measured foundational workplace mathematical reasoning and problem-solving skills from basic addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division to multiple math functions like calculating percentage discounts and markups.
- Graphic Literacy** measured reading comprehension and critical thinking skills using written text, including emails, websites, letters, signs, notices, bulletins, policies, and regulations.
- Workplace Documents** measured comprehension and application of workplace graphics, such as, charts, graphs, tables, forms, flowcharts, diagrams, floor plans, maps, and instrument gauges.
